The MODA Board's mission and responsibility is to provide information to Menlo Oaks' homeowners and residents, about all issues that may impact our community and to ensure excellent communications between our resident's and the City, County and other groups that may raise issues that impact our community.

To that end, we have done everything we can to ensure that all Menlo Oaks Residents are fully informed of the County's proposal on Coleman Avenue and that as many residents as possible, were prepared to participate in the ballot that the County recently distributed.

Our efforts have included supporting all public meetings hosted by Supervisor Richard Gordon, distributing email communications with links to the MODA website containing information on the Coleman issue, and distributing flyers to notify residents of the public meeting that took place on February 23<sup>rd</sup>.
